Jesus Shall Reign was:

- ♪ Written by Issac Watts in 1719
- ♪ Based on Psalm 72
- ♪ Was an early missionary hymn
- ♪ Was sung in the South Sea Islands by the natives of Tonga, Fiji, and Samoa on the commissioning of a new Christian constitution replacing a secular one for the people who were formerly cannibals.
- ♪ In 1925, less than a year after winning the gold medal at the Paris Olympics, Eric Liddell (Scottish Olympic athlete who was the focus of the award-winning film Chariots of Fire) left to become a missionary in China. When he was leaving Edinburgh's Waverley Station, he was asked to comment and instead of making a statement he sang: 'Jesus shall reign where'er the sun/ Does his successive journeys run/ His kingdom stretch from shore to shore/ Till moons shall wax and wane no more.'
